

The Story of Milk: From Grass to Glass



The most common type of milk comes from a dairy cow. Meet Lola, the Bath and West cow.

The farmer will milk me and my friends 2 or 3 times per day. This helps to keep us comfortable and happy on the farm.



The milk will then be stored and chilled before a tanker comes to collect it.



Once at the factory, the milk is processed to stop it turning sour. This is called pasteurisation.



Some types of milk such as semi skimmed have the fat removed.



The milk is put into bottles or cartons and is sent to different shops to be sold.



It is then ready to be bought at the shop and used at home.

There are farmers up and down the country who keep cows for their milk production! These farmers are called Dairy Farmers.
